

LONDON 2012 CULTURAL OLYMPIAD - LAND OF GIANTS

THE BRIEF...

To WRITE / DESIGN / DIRECT the biggest outdoor show ever to be staged in Northern Ireland on the historic Titanic slipway in Belfast.

To be performed to a live audience of 30,000 - the show recruited cast, crew and creatives from across all communities within the provence and was charged with reflecting the giants of Northern Irish history and inspiring the giants of the future.

THE SITE ...

Hallowed ground for anybody remotely interested in anything let alone historical gold. But also a unique staging challenge with a long (250 metre) but narrow site one would expect from the slipway that built and launched the HMS Titanic. In addition the new Titanic Visitors Centre anchored the bow but also crucially for me, inspired flight and my imagination with its wing and book-like facade.







THE IDEA...

3 months of fact finding and research uncovered an ideal linear narrative.

The consensus that the nation was a sleeping giant gave me Gulliver's Travels which then led historically to linen making, a glorious musical heritage, of course ship building and a photo album device that enabled the show to flick back and forward in time.







Most powerful of all were the people of Northern Ireland and their words. Poetry and prose ran through the country like the river Lagan that snaked through the site. Seamus Heaney led me to the T.S. Elliot Prize winning local poet Sinead Morrissey who wrote poetry and prose that ultimately formed the backbone of the entire show.

Our main character was then born - a young girl called Grace - who caught a letter A that fell from space - and planted it in the ground.



THE ARTWORK...

The visual identity leapt out at me as concept became reality. Reflecting the maritime history, shipping containers then naturally formed the backbone of the set.
